Approve the site alteration permit for the demolition of the existing attached garage, and the subsequent construction of a new 2 stall attached garage at 506 South Oak Street. Based on the findings that the changes proposed match the existing Greek revival home.

The attached plans show a new 2 stall garage at 506 S Oak St. the garage would be 26' wide, and an average one-story elevation. 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

Significant Details	The basic plan is a front gabled house with a long two story ell to the north. The main block is a fairly simple Greek Revival front with a strong cornice. The porch is apparently a restoration, but the entry door is excellent with flanking sidelights. Records state that the ell was brought over on the ice from Wisconsin. Its gable end features a pointed Gothic hood over narrow paired arched windows. There is a bay window underneath it. There is a brick chimney on the ridgeline. Mot windows are 1/1 and retain much of the original framing. There is a two bay detached garage on the lot.

Historic Background	Leonard S. Van Vleit was an adjutant quartermaster during the Civil War, retiring with the rank of major. he and his wife, Martha, were natives of Vermont. After coming to Lake City in 1867, he built this house. He organized the First National Bank in 1870.			
	It was later the home of Oscar Anderson, owner of a billiard room and real estate investor. Anderson served as alderman an two terms as mayor. His occupation is listed as "capitalist" in the census, suggesting his wide ranging business interests.
